



Stress-Coping Model of Care-giving


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Determining socio-economical factors







Does caregiving cause difficulties in your **relationships with friends**? (always/often in %)




Does caregiving have a negative effect on your physical health? (always/often in %)





Does caregiving cause difficulties in your **relationship with your family**? (always/often in %)








Does caregiving have a negative effect on your emotional well-being? (always/often in %)















Do you feel that anyone appreciates you as a caregiver? (always/often in %)




Overall, do you feel well supported in your role of caregiver? (always/often in %)



In the next year, are you willing to continue caring for the elder?





Conclusions

- The results on carers' burden reinforce the results from other studies with regard to the importance of behavioural problems.
- However, memory problems become just as significant as behavioural problems when carers are asked about satisfaction with support from services, and older people with memory problems have a higher risk of being in a care home after a year.
- Despite perceived burden, positive value of caring is high in our sample, and the will to care for elderly relatives remains high for the vast majority of family carers.
- Correlations are only moderate, with most variance remaining unexplained.
- This is probably grounded in different coping capabilities and care arrangements – the next presentation will consider this.
