

University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf

The University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf (UKE) is one of the largest medical centers in Germany and stands at the forefront of research and state-of-the-art medical treatment. Founded in 1889, the UKE opened its ultramodern main building in 2009, and is thus one of the most modern hospitals in Europe, incorporating 13 centers with a total of 80 departments, clinics, policlinics, and research institutes with more than 1,700 beds. Each year the medical center treats approximately 104,000 inpatients, 402,000 outpatients as well as about 128,000 emergency patients.

Being a university hospital, we combine medical treatment with research and education. One of the cornerstones of the UKE mission is to continue developing novel and improved diagnostic methods and procedures for disease management, in particular for complex and rare medical conditions.

State-of-the-art medicine for the wellbeing of our patients

UKE is the only hospital in Northern Germany that can carry out many highly specialized and complex treatments,

especially in the fields of cancer, bone marrow transplantation, heart diseases, urology, as well as many other categories. The UKE is also home to the world's leading medical facility for the treatment of prostate cancer.

The hospital's medical treatment, science, and research have an excellent international reputation. To ensure maximum privacy for our patients, the hospital has only private (1 bed) and semi-private (2 bed) rooms. Modern and bright rooms provide a positive environment and in our shopping arcade patients and their relatives find a mini-mart, bank, post office, florist, hairdresser and beauty salon. We also attend to the culinary wellbeing of our patients. Each day, patients may choose from over twenty menu selections. Of course, religious and cultural dietary preferences are taken into consideration. Located on the UKE grounds there are several cafés and restaurants under the name "Health Kitchen". where the patients and their families can enjoy a variety of delicious options.



Centers of Excellence



Prof. Dr. med. C. Bokemeyer

Oncology: In the Department of Oncology and Hematology, under the direction of Professor Dr. Carsten Bokemeyer, we primarily treat patients with cancer of the internal organs and the hematopoietic system. Treatment, including the use of new anticancer drugs, is frequently based on the molecular features of the respective cancer types. Our special expertise includes the diagnosis and treatment of blood cancers (leukemia and lymphoma), urogenital tumors (especially testicular cancer), and malignant tumors of the gastrointestinal tract (especially colorectalcancer), sarcoma, lung cancer and tumors of the head and neck as well as blood clotting disorders.







Prof. Dr. med. N. Kröger

Stem Cell Transplantation: The UKE stem cell program for children and adults, under the leadership of Professor Dr. Nicolaus Kröger, has been one of the largest in Germany and Europe for many years.

Exceeding the high international standard of Quality (JACIE Accreditation), we perform various types of stem cell transplantations: autologous, allogeneic from HLA identical sibling, matched and mismatched unrelated donors, cord blood and haploidentical transplantation. The department is one of the world leaders

in the field of stem cell transplantation especially for myelofibrosis, multiplemyeloma, myelodysplastic syndrome and acute leukemias, which we also successfully perform in elderly patients (65+). Furthermore, we chair several multicenter European studies on allogeneic stem cell transplantation.





Prof. Dr. med. Prof. h.c. Dr. h.c. Jakob R. Izbicki

General Surgery: Under the leadership of Professor Dr. med. Professor h.c. Dr.h.c. Jacob R.Izbicki, FACS, FRCS Ed.Hon, we offer the best possible treatment for diseases of the chest, lungs, abdomen (including liver and stomach) and hormone-producing organs. Our department has vast experience with operations of the pancreas and esophagus and is one of the largest obesity centers in Germany. Our options for treating malignant diseases range from partial

organ resection to the complete removal of several organ systems. We blend a comfortable atmosphere with the security of specialization through multidisciplinary cutting-edge medicine found at the University Hospital.

Gynecology: Our clinic for Gynecology, led by Professor Dr. Barbara Schmalfeldt, represents a supraregional center of excellence for surgical and conservative gynecological oncology as well as a leading breast center. We offer minimally invasive and radical gynecological surgeries, performing at the highest medical level. All subspecialties of the field, such as gynecological oncology, surgical and conservative gynecology, uro-gynecology

and endocrinology, are represented. For patients with advanced ovarian cancer we achieve higher rates of complete tumor excision and thus significantly longer survival rates compared to the average of all German hospitals.

University Obesity Center: Led by Professor Oliver Mann, the University Obesity Center is one of four centers of excellence in Germany that have been certified by a professional board (i.e. the German Society for General and Visceral Surgery) and is the only university center of excellence. Our specialists cooperate with partners at the national and international level and offer the latest therapy options for the treatment of obesity as well as obesity-related metabolic diseases. Our center offers all the latest keyhole surgery techniques (laparoscopy, always minimally invasive irrespective of the

patient's weight) and performs revision and adjustment surgeries.

In the field of complication management, we profit from our vast wealth of experience, which is the result of the high number of surgeries performed as well as its large number of highly specialized medical departments. Thus, numerous patients who had experienced complications following bariatric surgeries performed by other clinics have been transferred to our center and treated by our medical team.

Plastic Surgery: Treatments offered at the Department of Plastic Surgery, led by Professor Dr. Dr. Marco Blessmann, are reconstructive surgery, esthetic surgery, breast surgery and adiposity surgery, focusing on the best possible restoration of physical integrity, functionality and esthetics. We primarily focus on the treatment and reconstruction of all physical defects caused by trauma, infection, ulceration, systemic diseases, operation outcomes and hereditary malformation. Furthermore, all facial plastic surgical procedures including skin altera-

tions or changes, cosmetically disturbing scars and warts. We are also specialized in all esthetic plastic surgeries including the treatment with "filler", fat (-transfer) and Botulinum toxin (botox). Thanks to the interdisciplinary approach as well as international cooperation, we are able to offer an expertise at the highest level.

Neurosurgery: Under the direction of Professor Dr. Manfred Westphal at the Department of Neurosurgery, we treat patients with diseases of the brain and spinal cord. We particularly focus on procedures for treating tumors and vascular diseases of the brain. By means of special techniques such as minimally invasive surgery, endoscopy, laser dissection,

intraoperative monitoring and awake brain surgery, we can perform these procedures gently and successfully.




Pituitary Surgery: Surgically treatable diseases of the pituitary gland and surrounding structures have played an important role in neurosurgery at the UKE for over 40 years. The pituitary surgery division of the UKE is one of the two largest in Germany, treating tumors in more than 250 patients per year. Whenever possible, we offer the patient transnasal surgery, as this technique provides better

results at a lower risk. Besides pituitary adenomas, craniopharyngiomas and suprasellar meningiomas may also be suitable for this procedure.

Urology: The Department for Urology, under the direction of Professor Dr. Margit Fisch, is an innovative department treating men, women, and children, offering extensive diagnostics as well as conservative and surgical procedures. We are a leader in reconstructive urology including urethral reconstruction and urinary diversion, laparoscopic surgeries (e.g. of the kidney), and holmium laser enu-

cleation for benign enlargement of the prostate. We offer fluorescence-based, photodynamic (HEXVIX®) diagnosis and therapy of urinary bladder tumors.

Martini-Klinik Prostate Cancer Center:

The Martini-Klinik is a highly specialized private hospital treating patients suffering from prostate cancer. We offer a complete portfolio for diagnosis and therapy and, together with the UKE, we care for approximately 5,000 outpatients every year.

The operations at the Martini-Klinik are usually performed in a nerve-sparing procedure. With this sophisticated operating technique in the vicinity of the sphincter muscle of the bladder, continence can usually be maintained. With approx. 2,200 prostate cancer surgeries

annually, we perform the highest number of complete (radical) surgical removals of the prostate worldwide. Moreover, the Martini-Klinik and the Urology Department and Clinic of the UKE are firmly established as sought-after partners for national and international research collaborations on prostate cancer due to the extensive and high-quality data and tissue resources and its renowned research.

University Heart & Vascular Center Hamburg (UHC)

The University Heart & Vascular Center Hamburg (UHC), a 100% affiliate of the University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf (UKE), is comprised of general and interventional cardiology units specializing in pediatric cardiology, cardiovascular surgery and pediatric heart surgery and vascular medicine. Specialists at UHC place heavy emphasis on interdisciplinary treatment; the teams work closely together, discussing each individual case and developing a customized treatment plan to cater to each patient's needs.

The Department of Cardiovascular Surgery specializes in the treatment of heart valve and coronary artery conditions, offers the most up-to-date minimally invasive surgical techniques, such as endoscopic operations or the so-called hybrid approach. It is one of the few centers in Germany with the ability to perform aortic replacement through a heart catheter. An increasing number of patients at our medical facility receive intra-operative ablation therapy to treat atrial arrhythmia.

The center is staffed with experts in the field of cardiac insufficiency (heart failure) treatment implanting high tech de-

fibrillators and artificial hearts. The UKE University Heart & Vascular Center was the first medical facility in Europe to use the MitraClip technique to treat mitral valve insufficiency.

Prof. Dr. med. S. Blankenberg

Department of Cardiology: Our department, led by Professor Dr. Stefan Blankenberg, treats patients suffering from all types of cardiovascular conditions. Along with its expertise in the diagnosis and treatment of coronary conditions, our department specializes in the treatment of cardiac insufficiency (heart failure), defective heart valves and dilation of the aorta (aortic aneurysm). We are one of the few medical facilities in Germany to perform mitral valve repair and implantation using a heart catheter for treating heart valve leakage (mitral regurgitation). To date, the University Heart & Vascular Center in Hamburg has treated more patients using the so-called MitraClip procedure than any other medical facility worldwide and is one of the very few centers offering transcatheter mitral valve replacement.

One particular focus of department constitutes a full range of diagnostic and therapeutic methods for all forms of bradycardic and tachycardic arrhythmia. Innovative 3-D mapping- and navigationtechniques (CARTO®, Hansen, NavX®) including cryo ballon technology are the standard in our examinations. Being one of the largest centers of its kind in Europe, we are also able to offer the necessary expertise for the implementation of modern pacemakers and defibrillators as well as interventional electrophysiology (examination of heart rhythm and catheter ablation).

Department of Heart and Vascular Surgery: A full range of cardiac and vascular diseases are successfully treated at our Department of Heart and Vascular Surgery under the direction of Professor Dr. Hermann Reichenspurner, Ph.D. Our fields of specialization include treatment of diseased coronary vessels by gentle, minimally-invasive techniques using arterial bypass grafts and the full range of endoscopic surgeries of heart valves. As one of the major centers in Germany we also offer valve replacement via a cath-

eter-based procedure. A special focus of our department are state-of-the-art procedures, such as robot-assisted surgeries and so-called hybrid approaches. Another aspect is the treatment of patients suffering from terminal heart failure, including implantation of ventricular assist devices or cardiac transplantation.


Prof. Dr. med. E. S. Debus

Department of Vascular Medicine: The treatment of vascular diseases at our Department of Vascular Medicine, led by Professor Dr. Eike Sebastian Debus FEBS FEBVS, is highly complex and requires an interdisciplinary approach: the department includes vascular surgeons, interventionalists and angiologists. In addition, in close collaboration with the specialists from the Departments of Cardiology and Heart and Vascular Surgery, we provide treatment of aortic aneurysms and dissections (type B dissection)

at all segments as well as thoracoabdominal aortic endovascular and open replacements. A special focus of our department is the treatment of advanced severe peripheral occlusive diseases and chronic wounds as well as venous malformations by means of embolization.



The pediatric heart program offers a multi-professional network with the highest level of expertise for children with heart diseases under the direction of Prof. Dr. Rainer Kozlik-Feldmann, Department of Pediatric Cardiology, Prof. Dr. Mark Hazekamp, and PD Dr. André Rüffer, Department of Pediatric Heart Surgery. Using state-of-the-art equipment of one of the leading heart centers in Europe, we perform approximately 300 catheter interventions as well as 250 cardiac surgeries and hybrid procedures for simple and complex congenital

heart defects and many different types of pediatric heart disease. Additionally, we offer a cardiac assist device and heart transplantation program for end stage heart disease in pediatric patients. Last but not least we are a certified supra-regional center for adults with congenital heart disease (ACHD) using all clinical and research resources of our large medical campus.

The new UKE Pediatric Center creates optimal conditions for a customized, state-of-the-art treatment of pediatric disorders. Modern medicine coupled with lovingly designed rooms were conceived with our young patients and their parents in mind. Improved interdepartmental communication, short distances between the units and complementary multidisciplinary treatments are the concepts on which the new UKE Pediatric Center is based upon.

Among other treatments, we currently provide specialized, multidisciplinary treatments for children and adolescents

suffering from all types of disorders affecting the gastrointestinal tract, the pancreas, the liver and the bile ducts. The Pediatric Center focuses primarily on treatments, such as complex neuropediatric diagnostics, liver and kidney transplants using living related donations as well as treatments of brain tumors and stem cell transplantation for hematological disorders.


