






Panelists:





Prof. Baines received his Ph.D. from the University of Munich. After a postdoctoral phase in Cologne and a group leader position in Munich, he became a professor at the Institute for Experimental Medicine at Kiel University and guest group leader at the Max-Planck Institute for Evolutionary Biology in 2009. His current research focuses on evolutionary genomics, population genetics, and bacterial metagenomics.



Prof. Dr. Timo Gemoll, University Clinic Schleswig-Holstein (University Hospital Schleswig-Holstein, Campus Lübeck)

Prof. Gemoll studied Molecular Life Sciences in Lübeck and received his Ph.D. in Cancer Proteomics at the Karolinska Institutet, Sweden. After a postdoc phase, he held a W1 professorship for "Oncological Proteomics" in 2015, which was tenured into a permanent W2 position in 2021. He is the acting head of the Section for Translational Surgical Oncology & Biobanking, Department of Surgery at the Lübeck University and UKSH, and a member of the UCCSH.



Dr. Sanjay Tiwari, University Clinic Schleswig-Holstein (University Hospital Schleswig-Holstein, Campus Kiel)

Dr. Tiwari obtained his Ph.D. at the University College of London, UK. Subsequently, he was a postdoctoral fellow at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute at Harvard Medical School in Boston, USA, researching in the field of hematological diseases. Since 2004, he has been working as a principal scientist at the University Hospital in Kiel where his research interest is focused on the application of molecular imaging in testing novel therapeutics in cancer.



PD Dr. Jasmin Wellbrock, UCCH/UKE Hamburg

Dr. Wellbrock obtained her Ph.D. at the University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf. In 2011, she started her postdoctoral phase at the UKE Department of Hematology and Oncology and has been co-PI and group leader of the research group "Acute Leukemias" since 2015. She serves as a lecturer for Biochemistry at the Medical Faculty and regularly holds seminars for medical students and students of Molecular Life Sciences. She is the mother of three sons.



Prof. Dr. Matthias Wilmanns, EMBL Hamburg/UKE Hamburg

Prof. Wilmanns obtained his doctoral degree at the University of Basel, Switzerland. Since 1997, he has headed the EMBL outstation on the DESY campus in Hamburg and founded the Center for Structural Systems Biology in 2014. Since 2015, he is also a professor at the Medical Faculty of the University of Hamburg. His research focuses on structural biology, in particular by X-ray crystallography to determine the structures of biological macromolecules.



Prof. Dr. Isabell Witzel, MPH, UKE Hamburg

Prof. Witzel is a trained clinician and holds a master's in Public Health. Since 2002, she has been working in the Department of Gynecology at the University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf. Since 2013, she is head of the Breast Center and spokesperson for the Center of Excellence for Familial Breast and Ovarian Cancer. Since 2020, she has also been the equal opportunity officer for the scientific staff and students of the Medical Faculty. She is a mother of three children.
