Language of instruction	All classes and exams take place in German.
Language requirements	A German level of B2 (CEFR) is required at the start of the semester. A proof of a minimum level of B1 must be provided with the application documents by 31 May.
German language course	The University Language Center offers free intensive classes in September/October and March as well as regular semester classes: <u>https://www.uni-hamburg.de/en/sprachenzentrum.html</u>
Transcripts of records	Students must attend at least 85% of classes to be admitted to examinations. The Transcript of Records will be sent to the international office of the home university or the student once the academic cycle has ended.

Semester contribution	The reduced semester contribution (Semesterbeitrag) for international guest students amounts to approx. €300 and is not the same as tuition fees. For example, the contribution also includes a semester public transport pass for the city of Hamburg (www.hvv.de).
Accommodation	There are limited rooms in dormitories reserved for incoming exchange students. The application form is available on our website.
Buddy programme	The Faculty of Medicine offers a buddy programme to guide exchange students before and after their arrival in Hamburg.
Scholarships for incoming exchange students	Not at present.
Non-EU students	Non EU-students, excepting students from Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland, need a visa for a stay in Germany longer than three months. Please contact the German embassy or consulate.
